- **Alternatives to the current way of thinking encourages people to access their inherent vitality.**
- **Homeopathy advocacy requires a team- practitioners, volunteers, clients and consumers.**

Advocacy & Collaboration

Advocacy & Collaboration

- **First responders brought in immediate need acute and long-standing cases.**



- **Short-term success with little follow-up**

Free Clinics

- **Major NYC medical system reached out about Denise providing homeopathy alongside traditional allopathic care.**
- **Most cases are not acute so full, complex cases must be taken and prescribed on in 20 minutes or less.**
- **Clinic located next to a soup kitchen so continuity of care can occur.**

- **Remarkable process for ascertaining the curative powers of a potentized substance.**





- **Two of the roles in a proving—prover and workers who review, organize and collate.**
- **Prover: Visiting a new destination for the weekend; you only understand yourself.**
- **Worker: Relocating, learning the language, experiencing the culture; you see the parts and pieces that EVERY prover experienced.**



Proving



- **Understanding of the energy signature of a foreign substance with greater clarity.**
- **Motivation of knowing that this may lead to healing for someone in need of healing specific to that substance.**
- **Process: Taking the substance, experiencing temporary symptoms, becoming aware of the ‘otherness’ its wants/needs/cravings and feeling the lifting which leads to a stronger more vital feeling of myself.**




Study Groups

- Participation on your own schedule






